: \$400,000,000 for election candidate funding;
Accumulating to \$1,200,000,000 for each 3 year election.

This amount divided equally between each of the 15,000 senate, house of representatives and local councilor seats.

So an amount of \$80,000 per seat for candidates.

For provision to each candidates party, organization, or to the independent relative to the number of first preference vote value received.

[The total amount paid to political parties in 1990 was \$13,000,000 for federal seats. 103 cents per representative first preference vote and 51 cents per senate first preference vote.]

Any political party, private company, union, media, or any other organization or individual may receive electoral candidate funding from the last election, plus other financial donations of money, free time, or advertising from individuals, unions, businesses or any other entity up to a grand total value of \$50,000,000 for the election period for political advocacy. Any entity may perform lobbying services on the issues on own behalf, may advocate voting preferences, and may receive commission for political advocacy up to the \$50,000,000 limit.

: \$50,000,000 1/3 for each of the 3 elections each year for payment to President candidates divided relative to the first preference vote value received from jurists. Presidential candidates may receive a maximum of \$5,000,000 from all sources for each electoral period.

An amount paid per vote being (the total budget for the year / 3) / the number of votes cast in each election.
